

How You Can Help

San Clemente Island goats need responsible breed stewards. You don't need have a large herd—it only takes two to breed. Start with a buck and a doe from two diverse gene pools, or get a couple of does and borrow an unrelated buck at breeding time.

Enjoy your goats as you work to help promote the breed. Show them, play with them, talk about them, but most importantly, get them bred and registered, and ensure that their kids go to good stewards who will also breed and register them. It's that easy.

There is a lot we're still learning about these goats, and you can have fun sharing your experiences with other breeders as we build and pool our collective knowledge.

If you can't be a steward, help someone else become one. Learn about heritage breeds. Help a 4-H member achieve their dreams of becoming a breed steward. Get creative and assist us in finding solutions to increase the local populations and geographical distribution of these goats. We all need to work together to make it happen.
